Teaching Sexual Behavior to Individuals with Significant Autism: Curriculum Planning and Ideas for Instruction

This session will focus on issues affecting individuals on the more severe end of the autism spectrum, which often includes significant delays in cognitive abilities and communication skills. Specific topics will include basic social awareness, safe and socially appropriate masturbation, private versus public behaviors, independent hygiene, and decreasing inappropriate behaviors related to sexual expression.

Building Knowledge and Social Skill Foster Appropriate Sexual Behavior in Individuals with High Functioning Autism and Asperger's

This session will focus on issues affecting individuals on the high functioning and Asperger's end of the spectrum, which often includes significant deficits in social awareness, social boundaries, conversation and communication skills, unique sensory issues, and pervasive deficits in perspective taking, despite minimal to no deficits in cognitive skills. Specific topics will include teaching social communication skills necessary for building romantic and sexual relationships, the increasing knowledge of the mechanics of sex, socially appropriate and safe sexual expression, fostering perspective taking, and decreasing dangerous and inappropriate sexual behaviors while in the social world.
